

Affording The Churchill School and Center

The Churchill School and Center builds community on the principles of diversity, equity, and inclusion. To help realize Churchill's vision of education available for all, the school maintains a financial assistance program. At Churchill, "need" is defined as the difference between the family's resources and the child's tuition expenses. To evaluate need, Churchill uses Clarity, an independent third-party platform. Parents applying for financial assistance must complete and submit the Clarity Application.

Admissions decisions are made separately from financial assistance decisions. Any student who applies to Churchill may apply for financial assistance. The Churchill School and Center imposes no income ceiling or minimum for families applying for financial assistance.

If a student receives financial assistance and enrolls in Churchill, Churchill expects the student and the student's family to become active and engaged members of the community, thereby enriching the fabric of The Churchill School and Center. Churchill expects that families will adhere to all school policies and other expectations as outlined in the Family Handbook.

Returning families are given priority access to financial assistance funds. To receive priority status, returning families must complete a financial assistance application by **November 14, 2025**. For consideration in the second round of financial assistance decisions, new families should complete their financial assistance application by

January 5, 2026. Funds are allocated on a rolling basis after this. Because funds are limited, it is crucial that families meet all financial assistance deadlines.

Returning families may also be eligible for additional support, up to \$3,000, to cover a portion of attorney's fees through Churchill's Financial Assistance Endowment Fund (FAEF). Only families who qualify for a "Full Connors" Enrollment Contract can apply for support from the Financial Assistance Endowment Fund. Eligibility will be determined by Churchill on a case-by-case basis, and financial assistance in one year does not guarantee it in succeeding years.

Churchill's Financial Assistance Endowment Fund is made possible by the generosity of our community, including a substantial contribution from Goldman Sachs Gives, which was facilitated by a Churchill parent. It is separate from Churchill's tuition financial assistance application process.

This funding is offered to families who are unable to advance payment for litigation expenses. Families receiving this monetary assistance must seek reimbursement for their litigation expenses in addition to tuition through settlement or due process hearing. Should the resolution provide for the reimbursement of such expenses the parent will be obligated to direct the amount reimbursed (up to the amount paid by the FAEF) to Churchill.



Financial Assistance FAQs

Who can apply for financial assistance?

Funds are available for families seeking initial admission/enrollment for the 2026-2027 school year. Funds are also available for currently enrolled students who wish to apply for the first time or re-apply. The Churchill School and Center imposes no income ceiling or minimum for families applying for financial assistance.

Should I apply for financial assistance?

If you believe your financial resources are not sufficient to meet the cost of a Churchill School education, you are strongly encouraged to apply for financial assistance. Churchill utilizes an independent third party, Clarity, to calculate a suggested need based on financial information provided by the family. Clarity provides a common base by which each family's needs can be measured fairly and equitably.

Does applying for financial assistance influence the admission decision?

No. The Churchill School does not use financial need as a consideration in determining a student's eligibility for admission. The admissions and financial assistance processes are separate and distinct. No decisions regarding financial assistance are made until a student is accepted.

How is financial need determined?

Financial need is defined as the difference between the cost of attending The Churchill School and Center and a family's ability to pay. The results of the Financial Assistance Assessment are sent by Clarity to The Churchill School and Center. Clarity provides the

school with a general recommendation regarding a family's ability to pay for education. Major factors in determining financial need include but are not limited to, home equity, supplemental income, payments to pension and retirement plans, discretionary spending, and lifestyle choices.

Regardless of marital status, The Churchill School and Center **requires** both parents to submit separate Financial Assistance Applications, tax information, and any other supporting documents that illustrate their financial situation. In addition, domestic partners, step-parents, and non-custodial parents must also provide the same information. Consideration of the non-custodial parent will be based upon the belief that a parent's contribution to education is a reflection of the ability to pay, not the willingness to pay. If there are unusual circumstances regarding the family situation or financial standing, you are welcome to contact the Financial Assistance Committee for a personal conversation.

How is financial assistance structured at Churchill? Can I receive financial assistance while pursuing funding from the Department of Education?

In this arrangement, the Enrollment Contract reflects an amount of upfront tuition owed by the family, determined by the Financial Assistance Committee, and the remainder of the full tuition rate as a balance that will be accepted as direct payment from the Department of Education (DOE), at the conclusion of the student's case.

For example - using the 25-26 tuition rate of \$79,000 for our K-8 students, a family receiving an assistance amount of **\$24,000** should expect to see a Partial Connors Enrollment Contract structured as below: (Note: installment payments for grades 9-12 are in italics)

Deposit: \$5,500 - due at Contract signing

November 15th \$16,500 - upfront payment by family (\$17,167 for 9-12 tuition)

January 15th \$16,500 - upfront payment by family (\$17,167 for 9-12 tuition)

April 15th \$16,500 - upfront payment by family (\$17,166 for 9-12 tuition)

May 31st

\$24,000 - will be accepted as direct payment from the DOE (Connors Funding). If your case is not resolved by May 31st, Churchill will extend the due date until resolution.

Families pursuing funding must provide written consent to the Churchill School to speak with their counsel/advocate, on an ongoing basis, for status updates. In addition, written updates from counsel/advocates are required simultaneously with the scheduled installment payment dates. It is the family's responsibility to ensure that these updates are provided.

Is there a repayment obligation when a family receives financial assistance from The Churchill School and Center?

Should you not be awarded full tuition at the resolution of your case, Churchill expects the amount of tuition granted by the DOE to first be utilized to pay, in full, the outstanding balance of Churchill's Private Tuition. The family must remit the amount awarded to Churchill up to, but not exceeding, the amount of Financial Assistance provided by Churchill. See the examples illustrated below in which the DOE tuition granted is equal and how it is applied to two different Churchill Financial Assistance amounts:

Private Tuition =	\$79,000	\$79,000
Churchill Financial Assistance =	\$ <u>50,000</u>	\$ <u>20,000</u>
Family Out of Pocket Tuition =	\$29,000	\$59,000
DOE Tuition Awarded =	\$40,000	\$40,000
Remittance to Churchill =	\$40,000	\$20,000
Amount of Tuition Forgiven =	\$10,000	\$ 0
DOE Reimbursement Retained by Family =	NA	\$20,000

Churchill expects that families will make all upfront tuition payments according to the tuition payment dates established in the Enrollment Contract. Financial Assistance for successive years will be rescinded in the event that a family's financial obligation is not met.

Should the family not be successful in their pursuit of reimbursement and/or direct payment, the enrollment contract will either be voided or an amended payment schedule may be considered at the sole discretion of the Financial Assistance Committee.

How do I apply for financial assistance?

The Churchill School and Center requires families to complete a financial assistance application through the Clarity website. As part of this application, The Churchill School and Center requires that a copy of the prior year's 1040 and W2 tax forms and supporting tax schedules (including K-1s if filed) be submitted. In addition, The Churchill School and Center may require recent pay stubs as well as documentation of other sources of income such as, but not limited to, social security payments, food stamps, public assistance, unemployment, child support, worker's compensation, etc. For details, please refer to our Financial Assistance Checklist & Timeline.

How soon should I apply for financial assistance?

Because requests for financial assistance may exceed the funds available, it is important to apply as early as possible. Funds are allocated first to returning eligible students and then to financial assistance applicants who meet the deadlines outlined in the Financial Assistance Timeline. Financial assistance offers will be presented at the time enrollment contracts are offered.

Applications for financial assistance may be completed past the deadlines and will be considered on a rolling basis. For priority consideration, please adhere to the deadlines below. While we strive to make a Churchill School education available to all qualified students, our financial assistance funds are limited. Applicants who have been accepted or currently enrolled eligible families who apply after the above deadline may be placed in a Financial Assistance Wait Pool. If funds remain available, Financial Assistance Wait Pool applicants will be reviewed on a rolling basis by the Financial Assistance Committee for possible assistance.

What is the deadline for applying for financial assistance?

Returning Parents/Guardians should submit their financial assistance application to Clarity by **NOVEMBER 14, 2025**. **New families** should submit their application by **JANUARY 5, 2026**. Families should refer to the Financial Assistance Checklist, provided below, for the documents required at the time of application. (*Note that copies of the December 2024 tax returns (and all schedules) should also be sent directly to Clarity by April 15, 2025.) The Financial Assistance Committee will notify families of decisions with their enrollment contracts.

Who makes decisions about financial assistance? Will this information remain confidential?

Financial assistance is determined by demonstrated financial need and offered by the Financial Assistance Committee. All names of students receiving financial assistance and all financial assistance amounts remain confidential.

Who provides the funds for financial assistance?

The Churchill School and Center funds all financial assistance. Clarity does not make financial assistance decisions, nor does it provide the money for financial assistance.

Can I appeal a financial assistance decision?

Families who are denied financial assistance or have questions about their assistance may submit an appeal by emailing financialassistance@churchillschoolnyc.org. Stating

details that explain the concerns, the letter must be specific and contain new information that was not in the original financial assistance application. The new information must be quantified and documented. Appeals that do not include new information will not be considered. Only one appeal is allowed. Appeals must be submitted within two weeks of receiving an initial decision. Families who do not meet this deadline waive their right to appeal. All Financial Assistance Committee decisions regarding appeals are final. All communication is between the Financial Assistance Committee and the applicant's family, except at the request and sole discretion of the Financial Assistance Committee.

Do I have to apply for financial assistance each year?

Yes. Eligible families must apply for financial assistance annually. To be eligible for financial assistance, a continued need must be demonstrated each year. While it is the goal of the Financial Assistance Committee to maintain funding consistently from year to year, the decision is always subject to current documented need and established criteria.

Do I need to apply for financial assistance if my child's case has pendency for the 2026-2027 school year?

Yes, if you feel you need financial assistance to pay tuition out-of-pocket. At Churchill, families must adhere to their contractual obligations, regardless of a student's Pendency status.

Given the length of time it takes to resolve due process proceedings, it is essential that Churchill receives scheduled tuition payments from families so we can continue to serve our students. Therefore, **families must pay tuition to Churchill as set forth and agreed to in their Enrollment Contract and payment schedule.**

If Churchill receives tuition payment(s) directly from the local school district, families will be reimbursed by Churchill for any excess tuition payments they made to Churchill.

A family may request an amended payment schedule **ONLY** if they have a Pendency Order or Agreement authorizing direct payment of tuition to Churchill **and** are in a substantially different financial situation from when they signed their Enrollment

Contract. For Churchill to consider such a request, the family must complete or update a financial assistance application in Clarity. If the Pendency Order does not specify that direct payment is allowed, the request will not be considered.

Aside from a signed enrollment agreement and timely tuition payments, Churchill requires that families who are entitled to Pendency provide the following on a **yearly basis:**

- the executed and dated **Pendency Order or Agreement**
- the Ten-Day Notice (TDN)
- the **Due Process Complaint**
- permission to speak directly with your attorney

Financial Assistance Timeline - Returning Families

OCTOBER-NOVEMBER

Returning families are given priority access to financial assistance funds. To be considered with priority status, submit a Financial Assistance Application by **NOVEMBER 14, 2025**, through Clarity, <u>accessible here</u>. This application will include your 2023 IRS tax forms, IRS schedules, and W-2 forms. If you have not completed your current year's taxes, *please make sure to submit last year's taxes*.

Applications for Financial Assistance may be completed past this deadline and will be reviewed on a rolling basis.

JANUARY-FEBRUARY

Contracts will be delivered with financial assistance decisions on **JANUARY 7**, **2026**. Fully signed contracts will be due on **JANUARY 22**, **2026**.

MARCH-APRIL

Submit IRS 2025 tax forms, IRS schedules, and W-2 forms.

Financial Assistance Timeline - New Families

FALL

Submit an Admissions Application before applying for financial assistance. Remember to check the box on the admissions application to indicate you are applying for financial assistance.

NOVEMBER-DECEMBER

Submit a Financial Assistance Application by **JANUARY 5, 2026**, through Clarity, <u>accessible here</u>. This application will include your 2023 IRS tax forms, IRS schedules, and W-2 forms. If you have not completed your current year's taxes, please make sure to submit last year's taxes. Applications for Financial Assistance may be completed past this deadline and will be reviewed on a rolling basis.

JANUARY-FEBRUARY

Families whose students have been accepted will receive their finalized Enrollment Contract with a Financial Assistance decision on **JANUARY 22, 2026**. Those families who receive an offer of acceptance prior to a Financial Assistance decision will have 10 business days after notification of the amount of financial assistance to execute their Enrollment Contract. After **January 22, 2026**, financial assistance decisions will be given on a rolling basis.
